



Information for Pre-Health Students

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General Information

Pre-health students are planning for careers in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, physician assistant, optometry, physical/occupational therapy, veterinary medicine, public health, and nursing. Pre-health students can study any major (STEM or non-STEM) as long as they complete professional school prerequisites. Admission is determined by many factors; it is important to balance academic excellence with clinical, research, service, and leadership experiences.

Quarter by Quarter Planning

Pre-health students are encouraged to plan their coursework as early as possible to ensure timely completion of degree requirements and professional school prerequisites. All students can develop a personalized quarter by quarter plan using the [Academic Planning Worksheet](#).

After meeting with a [department/program advisor](#) to add required major coursework, pre-health students can add professional school prerequisites to their plan (see [Pre-requisite Comparison Chart for the Health Professions](#)). Note: most health professional schools accept AP credit; check each institution's website to review specific prerequisites. Do not enroll in courses for which you have earned AP credit as no additional units will be earned.

The last step is for students to finalize their plan with a Seventh College Academic Advisor. Students can schedule a quarter by quarter planning appointment via Ask A Question on the [Virtual Advising Center](#) after successful completion of at least one quarter.
