



Explaining the Sixth, Seventh, & Eighth Colleges Shared Pod

- You only need to attend one Info Session (from any of these three colleges) to be eligible to apply for the pod.
- When completing your application, you can apply to all three colleges at once. Please note that other colleges outside of the Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Colleges pod have their own separate application requirements & timelines.
- Ranking preferences during your application you will get the opportunity to rank the three colleges in order of preference. You will also be able to indicate if you do not want to be considered for one of the colleges.
- The selection committee will try their best to match your college preferences but RA offers will depend on availability, operational needs and college fit this means that even if you indicate a preference for one of the colleges, you could be offered a position in any of the three colleges.



What is the RA role?

The Resident Assistant is an academic-year long, live-in paraprofessional staff member in the Office of Residence Life.

RA's are premier student leaders who share responsibilities for developing a sense of belonging in the residence halls to promote residents' personal and academic success in alignment with the mission and vision of the residence life






Sixth Residence Life





















Seventh Residence Life






Eighth Residence Life

Job Application & Timeline









- Application Opens: November 18th, 2025 @ 9 AM Pacific Time
- Application Closes: January 5th, 2026 @ 11:59 PM Pacific Time
 - No late submissions will be accepted
 - You <u>MUST</u> attend an Info Session to be eligible to apply
- 1st Round Interviews: January 26th 30th, 2026
 - Applicants will interview with staff members from Sixth, Seventh, or Eighth College. Virtual.
- 2nd Round Interviews: February 16th 20th, 2026
 - Applicants will interview with one college. Virtual or in-person depending on the College.

*If you are planning on living on campus next year you should still apply through the regular housing process - if hired as an RA, your housing will then be reassigned





Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: What is the interview process like?

A: When applying to the 6, 7, & 8 pod, applicants will rank their preference. If selected to advance, there will be two interview rounds. The first round will be virtual with staff members of Sixth, Seventh, or Eighth. The second round will be in person or virtual with only one college. Regardless of which college your complete your second round interview with, you can still be offered a position with any of the three colleges.

Q: Do Sixth, Seventh, & Eighth College students have an advantage over students in other colleges?

A: We welcome students from all colleges to apply! There is no preference based on college.

Q: Does becoming an RA affect your Financial Aid Package?

A: Potentially; it is based on your individual financial aid. Contact an advisor!

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: How much is the compensation?

A: Approximately a total of \$7,155 (a combo of Dining Dollars and Triton Cash).

Q: Average amount of hours per week?

A: IT VARIES but its an estimated 19.5 hours / week. But, there are different factors to consider (Bulletin Boards/OTMs/Duty Shifts/ETC.

Q: Are programs made individually? Can you work with other people?

A: We have different programmatic requirements in each college per quarter/year. (Traditionals, Large Scale Programs, Socials, K&T, etc.) You will have the opportunity to both collaborate with other RAs and host your own programs throughout the year.
